Grand entrances planned for Gables

Sixty-five years after Coral Gables founder George Merrick abandoned plans to build entrances all around his city, Gables residents

are picking up the project.

The Coral Gables Garden Club
has started a new "adopt-an-entrance" campaign, and has completed plans for the first new entrance, to be built at Red Road and Coral Way. Construction should begin by the end of the year.

"Hopefully we'll get one or two or three a year," said Betsy Adams, Garden Club president. "We're going to keep working on it and continue on this project for the next five or six years - whatever it takes."

Before being driven out of business by hurricanes and a real estate bust, Merrick completed the Douglas Entrance, the Granada Entrance, the Commercial Entrance (at Alhambra Circle and Douglas

designed by Merrick's architect, Denman Fink, but never built. The Red Road-Coral Way intersection was to be the site of the "gladeside entrance," said Ellen Uguccioni, the city's historic preservation adminis-

The entrances are focal points for the city, she said.

"They automatically tell you you're now inside a new community," Uguccioni said.

Designing and building new gates to complement the old ones won't hurt the historic quality of the originals, she said.

City Architect Subrata Basu already has completed renderings of the new entrance, to be on the north and south sides of Coral Way, east of Red Road. It will be about 12 feet

The new entrance will cost The new entrance will cost \$65,000 to \$75,000, with most materials and labor donated by Gables businesses, Adams said. The city's Public Works Department is providing some in-kind services, like Basu's renderings.

The entrance project got enthusiastic endorsement from the City Commission last month.

The Garden Club plans to meet with all the city's civic clubs to interest them in adopting an entrance.

Club members and city staffers have found seven other entrance sites, including the intersections of Red and Bird roads, Miracle Mile and Douglas Road, and Le Jeune high at the ends.

New Gables gate fulfills old dream

One of the newest additions to Coral Gables is a reality because of an old idea put forth by George Merrick, the city's founder. A new entranceway to the city, the first built since 1926, was dedicated Tuesday at the site on either side of Coral Way just east of Red Road.

The dedication was made possible

through the efforts of the Coral Gables Garden Club, the City of Coral Gables and local businesses. Four additional entranceways are planned through a program called Adopt an Entrance Project. It is an attempt to complete Merrick's original plans to have decorative entrances at all major roads leading into Coral Gables. The original four

entrances were completed in 1926.
Mediterranean-style pillars, decorative walls, water fountains and landscaping are features of the new Coral Way structures that cost approximately \$70,000.
The city's public works department was responsible for the design and construction.

Garden Club gives Gables 3/48/91 new gateway to community

A dream begun by Coral Gables founder George Merrick in 1921 is coming true 70 years later.

Merrick's Mediterranean-style city was to have signature entrances at all main intersections. He completed four before his real estate bubble burst: the Douglas Entrance, the Granada Entrance, the entrance at Alhambra Circle and Douglas Road and the Country Club Prado Entrance.

Now, the entrance at the Red Road and Coral Way intersection is almost finished, thanks to members of the Coral Gables Garden Club, who began an "adopt-an-entrance" campaign and collected cash, building materials and labor from area residents and businesses.

"I thought it would be nice to leave something long-lasting instead of a shrub," said Betsy Adams, Coral Gables Garden Club presi-

Adams presented the idea to the club in January 1990 and got city commission permission

in April.

City architect Subrata Basu drew renderings of the new entrance, which will be 14 feet high at each end and will cost about \$85,000. It is expected to be the largest and most expensive new entrance.

"We're not trying to replicate old entrances but carry on tradition by providing gateways to the city at different locations," Basu said.

The garden club also plans to raise funds for entrances at Douglas Road and Miracle Mile, Le Jeune Road near Alhambra Circle, Ponce de Leon Boulevard and Bird Road, U.S. 1 and Red Road and Red and Bird roads.

"It's going to be maybe five or six years," Adams, said, "but we'll stay with it."
