

**Horticulture
Check Up:
Panty Hose vs
Plastic Tie**

**And how does
your Bletia grow?**

It's a good time to check up on the orchids that were distributed by Fairchild at last April's workshop. The 2 photos show Encyclia Tampensis and the ground orchid, Bletia Purpurea. So far, so good! My Encyclia is attached to a thin trunked palm. I wrapped panty hose around the roots and it's doing very well. I have another Encyclia, but I used a plastic tie to secure it and it is not doing nearly as well. It seems the panty hose retains enough moisture to give the plant just what it needs. I use panty hose to secure all my plants to trees and it works very well.

The Bletia is also growing just like it should. It's under a large palm and gets filtered light. I did put a little wire cage around it as it does look like one of the many palm seedlings that you have to pull out every year! It was planted so the little bulb is above ground and I'm hoping to have flowers this coming spring. Hope yours are doing as well!
