Gather Around Our Blue Star Memorial Marker

On Friday, November 9, just a few short days from now, we will come together at the Coral Gables War Memorial Youth Center to dedicate our Blue Star Memorial Marker. This beautiful marker will be located in front of the Coral Gables War Memorial Youth Center and perpetually landscaped with flowers to honor and remember those brave men and women who serve our country in the Armed Forces. This project is a successful partnership between our Club, the City of Coral Gables and the National Garden Clubs.

Since the Blue Star Marker program began about 70 years ago, over 3,000 markers surrounded by flowering landscapes have been dedicated all across the country. In Florida our first Blue Star Memorial Highway Marker was dedicated on May 30, 1949 at the terminus of US 1 in Key West. Over 190 markers are now in place across our state. We are proud there will soon be a marker in Coral Gables. Member Evelyn Budde has been the driving force behind this project. It is an accomplishment that will be remembered as long as this marker stands, and I personally will think of Evelyn's determination and can-do attitude whenever I drive down University Drive past the Youth Center.

And now it is up to us, dear members, to honor our Armed Forces, our City, National Garden Club, Inc, Evelyn and our Club as we attend this Veteran's weekend memorial. Thank you to those of you who are bringing cookies! Please do come – this is an important event in the life and purpose of our club! Friday, November 9 at 11:00 AM!

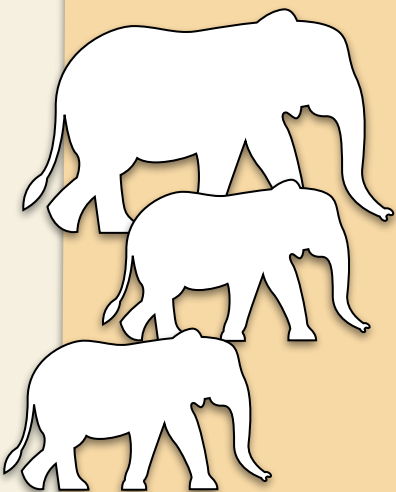
WHITE ELEPHANT SALE COMING ON NOVEMBER 26

Lamar Louise Curry ~ December 1906 - December 2012

Lamar Louise Curry taught U.S. history in Miami-Dade County schools for 35 year and lived it for more than a century.

On October 9th, 2018 the Coral Gables Garden Club asked for and received approval from the Coral Gables City Commission to name the triangular green space in front of the Venetian Pool the LAMAR LOUISE CURRY PARK.

Our Garden Club will share in building this park with \$200,000 bequeathed by Miss Curry to the club and would like to share a bit of her history with others when asked "who was Lamar Louise Curry".

Miss Curry, our beloved and cherished friend provided leadership, support, love and exceptional generosity to our club and our community.



- For Coral Gables Garden Club she helped our many projects, entrances and awards. One of the large fountains at Douglas Road and Miracle Mile is in her honor.

- Provided land to enable Marathon Garden Club to build a Club House in the Keys

- Provided a "Perpetual Garden" in Bay Front Park Miami next to the Astronauts "Challenger Memorial" with ongoing care and received the FFGC Leadership Award for this Garden. With extensive holdings in the Keys she helped to protect many acres of land with responsible building.

- For her dedication, inspiration and generosity to education the Lamar Louise Curry Middle School is named for her.

- The College of the Ozarks; Historical Museum of Southern Florida; The University of Miami Women's Guild; United Methodist Church and Children's Home; Fairchild Garden, and many others benefit from her generosity.



As a member of the Coral Gables Garden Club for 42 years, Miss Curry faithfully attended every meeting possible and was an example of how life should be lived.

As a history teacher for 35 years, 32 at Miami Senior High, she instilled the principles of love for our country in her students that included many of today's Miami leaders; judges, lawyers, doctors, entertainers, engineers, husbands, wives and mothers. She often admitted that she was strict but as her students put it "she was always fair."

She was a wonderful storyteller. Senator Bob Graham said "She taught history as an ongoing series of stories about human beings not just dry recitations of wars and other hallmarks of history courses".

Although having taught thousands she remembered each one. Living to be 105, her mind was sharp and with failing eyesight she remembered the words to hymns as we sung them together.

She was our friend.

Horticulture for November: As we are starting our growing season for vegetables and many herbs, here are a few hints and suggestions I've found helpful. Many veggies and most herbs do as well in containers as in the ground. Tomatoes are much easier to grow in pots as is lettuce. I've tried several varieties of tomato and Early Girl and Patio do quite well in our climate. Any cherry tomato also does well, but the larger sized varieties like Beefsteak don't. Broccoli and radishes, peppers and beans all do well in the ground and don't take up much space. As to herbs "mint, oregano, and lemon grass" thrive. I've had better results growing basil in clay pots rather than in the ground. Chives and thyme also do well. The sisso spinach has taken on the properties of kudzu, so if you want a tasty ground cover, I'll bring more sprigs to the next meeting. ~ Susan Thomas, Horticulture

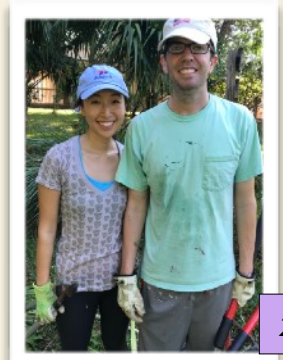
