**Crime Watch** - During the Holiday Season the Coral Gables police department protected many parcels that were delivered to front porches. Police officers stopped and either alerted the recipients if they were at home; otherwise they moved out of sight over 350 packages that were left on doorsteps. Thieves have stolen countless UPS, Fedex and US postal packages from porches throughout the country.

Innovation within the fire department is on the horizon when telemedicine arrives. This highly touted method will enable emergency rescue trucks with patients en route to hospitals to be able to visually interact with physicians, thus potentially saving untold lives when seconds count. Also within the fire department is a new rescue truck that has 360 degree view which will reduce substantially the danger of collisions that current fire and emergency trucks encounter on every run. Both the police and fire continue excellent performance for the protection and safety of its residents.

- ~ **Each member must bake 2 dozen cookies** (please deliver in disposable container, they will be plated by the hostesses at the reception.) Any questions call Denise West


