I am an optimist! I see all around me evidence that our species can find solutions to earth's problems if we try hard enough. I left Dr. Jaret Daniel's presentation yesterday with one thing still stuck in my mind, his photo of beautiful wildflowers along a highway. His simple suggestion to improve the chances for insects to survive was to ask the FDOT to mow the right-of-way every six or even twelve weeks instead of every three weeks. What a "win-win" that would be! Helping our pollinators thrive, while saving money, gas and emissions.

A few years ago, the Coral Reef Restoration Foundation came to speak to us about the alarming death of corals from bleaching. We supported their work in growing corals with a generous donation. After all, coral gardens are not so different from our own gardens above water. They are both beautiful, but also support a myriad of living creatures we would not like to lose. While snorkeling in Bonaire and St. Barth's last week, I saw what appeared to be old-time TV antennas anchored to the sea floor and spangled with tiny elkhorn and staghorn corals.. It was a magical sight, an act of hope and optimism.

Staring from the ship, I spied bits of bright pink and blue plastic floating with the Sargassum seaweed. My heart sank, but then I remembered how the ship had stopped using plastic lids, stirrers, and straws to keep them from flying overboard. A seemingly small but important effort to help stem plastic pollution of the seas.

And thanks to our member, Rhonda Anderson, we are once again growing little mangrove pups to replenish the mangroves along our shores. Please contact her to thank her for initiating this project and ask if you can foster a few pups of your own!

A quote of Jane Goodall's comes to mind:

"You cannot get through a single day without having an impact on the world around you. What you do makes a difference, and you have to decide what kind of difference you want to make."

Let us each decide to make a difference, one wildflower, mangrove pup or non-use of plastics at a time.

Working hard to make a successful House & Garden Tour




