## Bylaws Changes Plus Thank You, Villagers

### Bylaws Changes:

Please be aware of the changes in our bylaws that were approved at our February 28th General meeting. The following Bylaw addition was approved by the membership last year, but inadvertently omitted from the written Bylaws and the yearbook. Please make a note of this in your yearbook.

### Article IV Section 1 Item G.

Members wishing to change their status shall submit a request in writing to the membership chairman, no later than one week prior to the March Board of Managers Meeting.

The addition of the following standing rule was voted on at the February 28th general meeting and unanimously approved.

### Standing rule 14

An expenditure greater than \$500 shall need a 2/3 vote of the members present, without previous notice, or a majority vote of two weeks' notice of such vote.

## Butterfly of the Month: Baracoa Skipper

This is a tiny butterfly with a wing span of 7/8's of an inch to 1 and 1/8 inches. It is a native of Florida, and there are approximately 3,000 species of Skippers worldwide.

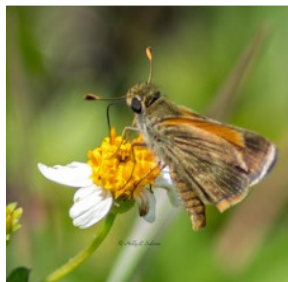

These tiny butterflies “skip” along to top of the grass. The butterfly is brown with orange on the forewing. It likes open areas and is widespread along roadsides and gardens. Skippers have proportionally larger bodies and smaller wings than other butterflies. This butterfly's host plants are tiny grasses and nectar plants, including lantana, Spanish needle and certain crotons. Can you imagine how small the caterpillar will be if the host plant is grass?

Until I started reading about them, I didn't realize that the little insects I saw “skipping” around my yard were tiny butterflies! Of course, my yard is the opposite of a perfect lawn although it is green. As a result, a lot of tiny nectar plants and host plants live in my “lawn,” which is why I have these little wonders. Isn't this a simple way to help nature? Quit fertilizing, watering and using pesticides on your lawn, and these little volunteer nectar and host plants will arrive!! What an easy way to become more attuned to our natural world...

Meet Our Scholarship Winner: Fabio Tarazona, Candidate for a Phd in Biology from the University of Miami

On a beautiful February afternoon, members of the Scholarship Committee, Sharon Trbovich, Glenda Haley, Beth Werner, Ruth Markham and Treasurer, Sandy Millage, met with the garden club's scholarship winner at The Gifford Arboretum for a chat and a chance to present him with a check.

We learned that he had first achieved his scientific focus at the age of 12, when his father took him to meet an Ornithologist in the Biology Department of the local university. The professor introduced the idea of using research to guide management and conservation in wildlife. By obtaining a doctorate in Biology, Fabio aspires to conduct sound, clean research and use it as a tool that benefits the community. He plans to evaluate the role of non-native Macaws in creating more resilient ecosystems in the Miami area.

Fabio will be a guest at the Garden Club May Luncheon.

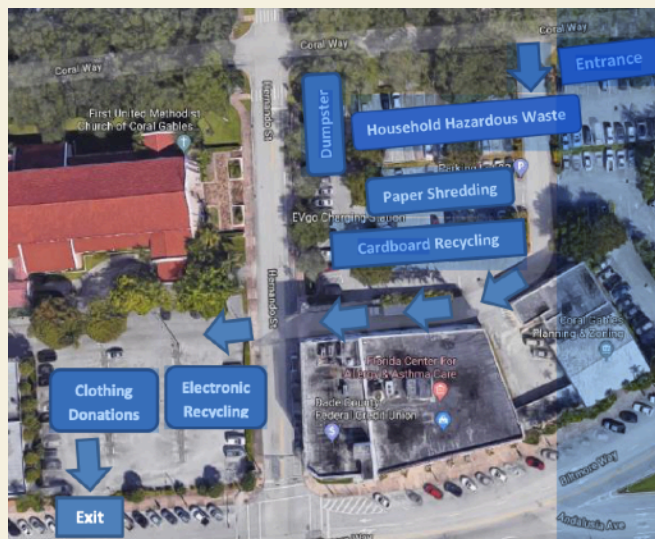
